

COVID-19: Vaccine Update



- Vaccines available to everyone 16 and older 4/15
 - Older Adults 65+ 1/13
 - High Risk Medical & Disability 3/15
- 28.5% Vaccines administered to 65+
- 4.8M 65+ have had at least one dose
- Next: <u>Myturn.com</u> expanding transportation & in-home services statewide

COVID-19: Golden State Stimulus



- The Golden State Stimulus is providing \$600 checks to approximately 1 million adults ages 65 and older. This includes an estimate of:
- 584,000 who receive Supplemental Security I payments
- 463,000 older adults who qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC)
 CA has only EITC in nation open to older adults
- 1,000 older adults who care for children participating in CalWORKS





Older Americans Act State Plan



- California must submit an <u>OAA State Plan on Aging</u> every four years to the federal Administration for Community Living (ACL). California's next State Plan is due to ACL on July 1, 2021 and goes into effect October 1, 2021.
- It is a statutorily required compliance document that focuses primarily on Older Americans Act programs.
- It is also a blueprint for California's OAA network to build equitable, age-friendly communities through programs, services, partnerships, and advocacy.



New: Public Comment on Draft OAA Plan



- The **Draft** OAA State Plan, which is aligned with the AAA Local Area Plans, the Governor's Master Plan for Aging, and CDA's Strategic Plan, is now available on <u>CDA's website</u> for public review.
- Stakeholders and members of the public are invited to provide input via CDA's <u>OAA</u>
 <u>State Plan survey</u> until May 5, 2021.
- <u>Two public hearings</u> (remote) are also scheduled and primarily dedicated to public comment. (The two hearings will cover the same material.)
 - Public Hearing #1: Monday, April 26, 1 p.m. to 2:30 p.m.
 - Public Hearing #2: Thursday, April 29, 9 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.




- Master Plan for Aging (MPA) Implementation
 - o 20.0 full-time positions, \$3.26 million in 2021-22, and \$3.33 million in 2022-23 and ongoing (General Fun'd)
 - o Full proposal
- Extend and Increase Funding to the Aging and Disability Resource Connection (ADRC)
 - o 13.0 full-time positions, \$1.95 million in 2021-22, and \$1.87 million in 2022-23 and ongoing (General Fund)
 - o Full proposal
- Health Insurance, Counseling and Advocacy Program (HICAP) Modernization

 o 3.0 limited-term (2 year) positions, \$2.06 million in 2021-22, and \$2.04 million in 2022-23 (HICAP Special Fund)
 - Proposed Budget Bill Language (BBL) allowing flexibilities in accessing these funds
 - o Full proposal
- Office of the Long-Term Care Patient Representative (OLTCPR)
