LOS ANGELES REGION

The process of aging is shaped both by genetic "givens" and by psychological, social, and environmental factors that accumulate and interact to comprise "experience." **No two people age the same way**. Aging is a dynamic process.



88 cities spread over 4,000+ square miles, people from more than 180 countries, speaking 140 different identified languages

Only 10 States have an older adult population larger than Los Angeles County

By 2030, the older adult population in the Los Angeles region is expected to double, to more than 2.1 million individuals


The older adult population is becoming more racially and ethnically diverse than ever before

Half of 13 year-olds today can expect to blow out candles on their 100th birthday cake—and maybe a few more after that



- Older adult population is here, growing rapidly, increasingly diverse and requiring tailored approaches
 - One size does not fit all.
 - Age is appreciated as a stage of life, not treated as a social problem or disease-like state.
- Speed of change requires a flexible and quick responses - Local is where change happens.
- Growing Needs:
 - Increasing health disparities.
 - A lack of affordable and accessible housing options.
 - A lack of transportation options.
 - Hunger and food insecurity.
 - Economic insecurity.
- > Gaps in labor force readiness.
- Lack of disaster preparedness.
- State-level policy changes consistently fail to see that transitions happens at the local level for consumers, not just at the payor source. As a result, AAAs have been consistently excluded as a major stakeholder.

Serving Seniors – non-profit agency

Largest Senior Service Provider in San Diego

- 1.7 million meals FY '21; almost 3 million since pandemic began
- Focus on rebuilding congregate program
- Case Management, including mental health
- Access to healthcare/dental/legal
- Homelessness services; transitional housing
- Permanent supportive housing

Challenge – Homelessness

San Diego – 2020 Point in Time count

- 27% of adults experiencing homelessness are 55+
- 88% became homeless in San Diego
- 2,000 individuals

Los Angeles – 2020 Point in Time count

- 36% of adults experiencing homelessness are 55+
- 90% became homeless in Los Angeles
- 15,000 individuals



Recommendations – Homelessness

Serving Seniors' Needs Assessment

- Older adults need to be unique cohort economic issues primary cause of homelessness
- Prevention/shallow subsidy (\$300)
- Shelters dedicated older adult space; consider seniors-only shelters
- Training for providers link to ADRC's
- Assessment tools not optimized for older adults
- Must be prioritized in planning (not happening now)
- Need for more affordable housing with support services
