#### The 2021 Special Report: Race, Ethnicity, and Alzheimer's in America



"Despite decades of research and calls to action to ensure that health care is accessible and equal for all regardless of gender, race, ethnicity, geography and socioeconomic status, this aim is still far from reality for too many Americans."



### **Background on the Special Report**

- Conducted two nationwide surveys of U.S. adults and Alzheimer's caregivers.
- Surveys included responsed from: Asian, Black, Hispanic, Native and White Americans.

#### Examined attitudes and experiences, specifically regarding:

- Access to dementia care and support services
- Knowledge and understanding of the disease
- > Trust in health care, providers, and disease research
- Interest in clinical trials
- > Existence of discrimination and how that impacts care





**33% of Hispanic Americans** reported discrimination when seeking health care.

**34% of Asian Americans** reported discrimination when seeking health care.

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**50% of Black Americans** reported discrimination when seeking health care.

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42% of Native Americans reported discrimination when seeking health care.

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### **Topline Conclusions**

- Discrimination is a barrier to care, including Alzheimer's and dementia care, for a significant number of people of color.
- There is a strong desire to receive care from health care providers who understand their unique experiences and backgrounds, but there is relatively low confidence that there is access to such providers.
- Black Americans lack trust in research clinical trials, and half doubt that advances in Alzheimer's treatments will be shared.
- Knowledge, awareness, concern and stigma about Alzheimer's varies widely across racial and ethnic groups.
